Dorothy Day was a 20th century American journalist, social activist, and devout Catholic convert. In the 1930s, Day worked closely with fellow activist Peter Maurin to establish the Catholic Worker movement, a nonviolent, pacifist movement that continues to combine direct aid for the poor and homeless with nonviolent direct action on their behalf.

In March 2000, Pope John Paul II granted the Archdiocese of New York permission to open Day's "cause" for sainthood, thereby officially making her a "Servant of God" in the eyes of the Catholic Church.
