Every year at Seton-La Salle High School about \$85,000 in tuition aid is made available to students through privately funded scholarships established by alumni and others committed to Seton-La Salle and Catholic education. Currently, 15 scholarships are awarded to students each year.

The first private scholarship at SLS was established by **Nicholas Merrick '81** in 1998. Nick wanted to honor his mom, an educator and mother

of three, by establishing a scholarship for academic achievement. This Spring, the J.L. Merrick Scholarship will be awarded to two incoming freshmen for the tenth time.

Judith Merrick, Nick's mom, takes part in the selection process and helps narrow the field of nominees to five. Following interviews, the final selections are made and the recipients are invited to a reception with past recipients to meet and share their experiences.

As the list of recipients has grown, it is evident that the scholarship is working as intended—rewarding academic achievement and reinforcing a commitment to excellence. The first two recipients, **Bridget Meacham '02** and **Will Seath '02** are doing well. Bridget graduated from the University of Notre Dame with a BS in Accountancy and received her Masters in Accountancy from UND in

December 2006. She now lives in Chicago and is a consultant with FTI Consulting in the Forensic and Litigation Services practice; she volunteers with the Lakeview Food Pantry and is a member of the Chicago Businessmen's Orchestra.

Will Seath also graduated from UND in 2006 with a BA in Political Science. He worked as a reporter and anchor on KQV Newsradio 1410 AM in Pittsburgh for two years before returning to UND to work toward his Master's degree in architecture last fall. Subsequent Merrick scholars are also doing well and are attending college at UND, Boston University, Penn State, the University of Pittsburgh, Duquesne University and others.

A dozen more scholarships have been established since the inception of the J.L. Merrick Scholarship 10 years ago. There

are renewable four-year scholarships and one-time awards; some recognize service to church or community, others consider financial need or are limited to students from a specific parish or grade school. Together all these scholarships (see list at right) provide more than \$75,000 in aid each year, a vital enrollment tool for Seton-La Salle as parish and diocesan funding for Catholic education diminishes. These scholarships are an invaluable gift and help keep SLS a vibrant, diverse community. They also serve as lasting memorials to the individuals and purposes they honor.

The latest addition to SLS's list of scholarships is the **Elizabeth Seton Legacy Scholarship**. **Denise Mulder Carr '78**, **Marianne Kieda Hudzik '66**, and

Mary Agnes Price Stevens '68 (three former Betsy Award winners) determined that Elizabeth Seton High School women needed to become active as alumni and support today's young women. They contacted alumni and organized a committee. Last fall, more than 50 women who attended or graduated from ESHS began funding a new scholarship for an incoming female SLS student. The group plans to hold a reception at the former high school (now the Seton Center) to bring alumni together and recognize the first recipient on April 26, 2008.

Four Year Renewable Scholarships

Edward M. Ryan, Jr. Memorial Scholarship

Created eight years ago by the family of Edward Martin Ryan, Jr. '64, who was born with muscular dystrophy and received his high school diploma posthumously. Two renewable \$2500 awards are presented annually to incoming freshmen.

Bishop Donald W. Wuerl Scholarship

An anonymously funded scholarship to honor Pittsburgh's past Bishop includes a \$2000 award to one incoming SLS freshman who exhibits academic achievement, demonstrates financial need, and the endorsement of the parish pastor.

The Anna Marie Catanzaro Scholarship

Friends of the former assistant superintendent of secondary schools for the diocese and ESHS alum created this \$2000 award to one incoming SLS freshman who displays academic achievement, service to his/her church and/or community, and demonstrates financial need.

The William C. Stout Scholarship for St. Bernard Students

Named after the funder, a 1964 SHC graduate from St. Bernard's parish, this \$2000 award to a St. Bernard School graduate who displays academic achievement, service to his/her parish and/or community and will be attending SLS.

The Gus Gillespie Scholarship

The children of this 1964 alum created this \$1500 award to one incoming Seton-La Salle freshman from a Diocesan Catholic Elementary School who displays academic achievement, financial need and service to his/her school.

The Pittsburgh Community Fdn Fund for St Sylvester Students

An anonymously funded \$500 award to one St. Sylvester Grade School student attending Seton-La Salle Catholic High School who displays academic achievement, service to community and school and demonstrates financial need.

Crossroads Foundation Scholarship

For students from St. Agnes, St. Benedict the More, Holy Rosary, St. James, Cardinal Wright, Good Shepherd and Bishop Leonard-St. Mary of the Mount Academy with demonstrated financial need.

Generous Guests Spell Success for Gala

Trying to keep classroom technology up-to-date can be overwhelming for any school, and especially for private Catholic schools that receive no State or Federal aid. However, Seton-La Salle is blessed to have parents, friends and alumni who attend the SLS Dinner Auction. With their generosity, keeping up with technology is an easy task. Fourteen years ago, when a group of parents created the annual dinner auction to fund a computer lab and DSL internet access, they hit on an idea that has grown into the school's biggest fundraiser. The SLS Green & Gold Gala, with more than 364 live and silent auction gifts and 400 people in attendance, raised \$142,000 to fund computer lab upgrades, the purchase of software and other learning tools, and internet access.

Since its inception, the Dinner Auction has raised over \$1 million. This year's event, chaired by Patrick and Doris McGonigle and held at the Hilton Garden Inn at Southpointe, was the largest and most successful yet. Annual Fund Update

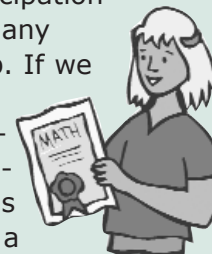
Our alumni are terrific. In January 2004, at the halfway mark for that fiscal year, \$33,750 had been raised for tuition assistance.

the 2007 Lady Rebel Volleyball Team

A Record-setting Season

The Lady Rebels Volleyball team finished a perfect (18-0) regular season with the perfect ending—the school’s first WPIAL Championship for women’s volleyball! The Rebels won play-off games against Brentwood, Our Lady of the Sacred Heart and Bentworth to win the title. 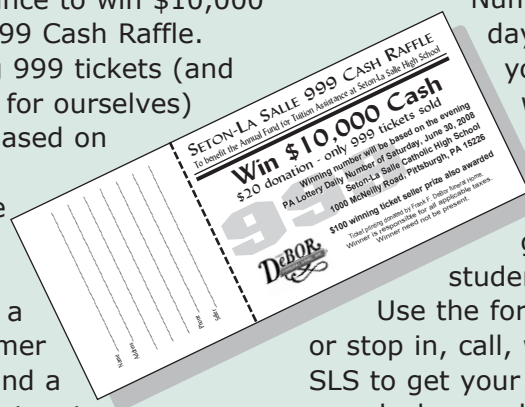

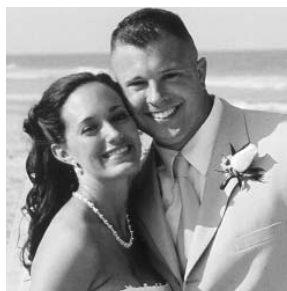

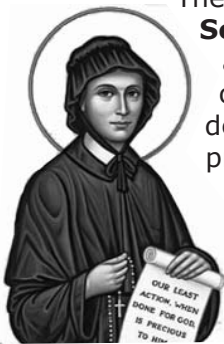

Changes made to SLS structure

In April 2007, the Diocese of Pittsburgh announced a restructuring of its seven diocesan high schools to clarify and improve their legal structures. The changes affect Bishop Canevin, Central Catholic, North Catholic, Oakland



Though not obvious to students or alumni, the organizational changes at SLS can have a lasting positive impact.

Catholic, Quigley Catholic, Serra Catholic, and Seton-La Salle.

"The changes are simple but important," said Father Lawrence DiNardo, the diocese' vicar for canonical services.

"Until now, the diocesan schools have been operating under the direct fiscal and administrative control of the Diocese of Pittsburgh."

In September, the schools were incorporated as individual Pennsylvania non-profit corporations and are no longer legal entities owned and operated by the Diocese of Pittsburgh. This change required Seton-La Salle to implement new bylaws and establish a board of directors made up of seven to 15 members. Four of the members are ex-officio representatives from the diocesan and school staffs.

A board of members with reserved authority in canonical matters was also put into place. Consisting of the diocesan bishop or the diocesan administrator, the vicars general and the diocesan secretary for education, the board of members is responsible for overseeing the work of each

board of directors.

Up to this point, Seton-La Salle had an advisory board in place. Its members helped direct the school, using their areas of expertise, their time, treasure and talent to assist and guide where needed. Several of these members have been approved for the initial Board of Directors. They will serve for 1 to 3 years to help create a staggered election process.

Father Kris Stubna, diocesan secretary for education, emphasized that while the high schools will now be separate corporations with specific responsibilities, little else will change in the operation of the high schools.

According to Father Kris Stubna, in an article in the *Pittsburgh Catholic* (5/14/2007) by Robert P. Lockwood, "The diocese will continue to provide the same services and oversight. Most important to parents, each school will be held accountable through the Secretariat for Education for curriculum and religious education, adherence to church and diocesan policies, and in their general practices. Father

Kris stressed that the legal changes would encourage more people to get involved in the work of building Catholic education.

"This is a good development for our schools," Father Stubna concluded. "The changes in structure are being made to strengthen the overall operation of our schools and make for a solid future for generations to come."
