The fair is free and brings in representatives from colleges, universities, career schools and the military to help parents and students make informed educational and career decisions. **THIS YEAR, WE WILL BE TRANSPORTING THE JUNIORS BY BUS TO THE FAIR ON FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 29.** Students will arrive at school as usual and the bus will leave at 9:00 AM. We will leave the fair at noon. If this timing conflicts with a student's lunch time, he or she should bring money to buy lunch at the Convention Center. We will arrive back at school at 12:45. Permission slips will be mailed home during the first week of February. The cost will be \$5.00. Parents are welcome to ride the bus free of charge.

PSAT Results

In December, students received their PSAT test results and an answer booklet. They can look up the questions they got wrong and work to improve their scores for the upcoming SAT. Students may access a link on the College Board website called "My College Quick Start," a personalized planning kit from the College Board. It provides online score reports, a customized study plan, a personalized lists of colleges based upon search criteria and a list of majors and careers. Juniors should visit the College Board website for the dates of upcoming SAT tests. We suggest the test be taken at the end of junior

year (either May 3 or June 7) and at the beginning of senior year. You may register online or pick up a paper registration form from the guidance office. The website is www.collegeboard.com.

SLS Financial Aid Applications Due

All families applying in the 2008-2009 school year for the Bishop's Education Fund (BEF), K-12 Scholastic Opportunity Scholarship Program (SOS), SLS Tuition Assistance, or any scholarship with a need-based component are required to complete and submit the 2008-2009 Private School Aid Service (PSAS) Form. Please note that families currently receiving aid must re-apply to be eligible for continued aid. We do not mail these forms out. However, they can be downloaded from our school website. Just click on "Tuition Assistance." Forms that are postmarked by March 14, 2008 are given first consideration. 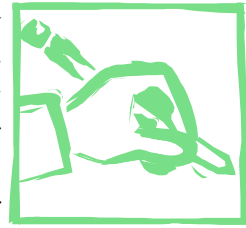

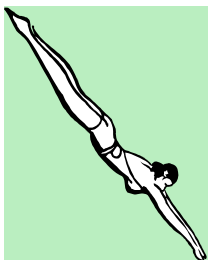
Winter Sports: Girls Basketball

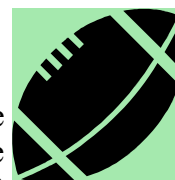
Baseball
