Message From the Principal

Dear Friends,

As we approach Holy Week, we stand at the moments of Christ’s greatest suffering—and of his greatest glory. I see many parallels between Christ’s sufferings and the economic crisis we face. Christ was innocent of wrongdoing. He was condemned by the selfishness and greed of others. He took up his cross and carried it to the end, despite pain, and fell more than once. He accepted help from Simon, an unwilling stranger, and by doing so, changed Simon’s life. He had compassion on the women of Jerusalem, not allowing his suffering to blind him to the sufferings of others. His journey continued to a bitter end; he was stripped of everything he had. He was nailed to the cross where he looked at the faces of those who hated him, despite all of his labors and sacrifices to bring them the Good News of His Father’s love. He had been betrayed and abandoned by those he thought his friends. But Jesus gave up his life, continuing to trust in the One who had sent him.

Like Jesus, some of us are innocent victims in this crisis. We trusted the economic system. Some of us were poor stewards of the gifts God had given us. Others were victims of the greed of others. Many among us are facing the loss of a job, mounting bills, fear of what more might come. We, too, must keep going and continue to do our best. Some of us must accept help—a blow to our pride and independence. Some, like Veronica, step forth willingly to help others. As taxpayers we are like Simon, forced to help those we don’t know—perhaps criminals who should be condemned. We fear what else we may lose and wonder where and how it will end.

The prayer of the Stations of the Cross asks: Jesus, I accept the deaths, the losses that will be a part of my life today, trusting in You. Give me the grace to trust in God. Show me how I may bring your love to others.

Christ’s Resurrection on Easter morning showed the power of God to bring life, even in the face of death. We must continue to try our best and keep close to God. We don’t know what our losses will be, but we do know that God is with us on the journey. Every day is a gift that brings blessings—sunlight, the coming Spring, blossoming flowers, love of family, supportive friends, God’s grace. Let hope fill your heart as you read the good news in this issue of *Rebelations*.

Rebels on the Radio

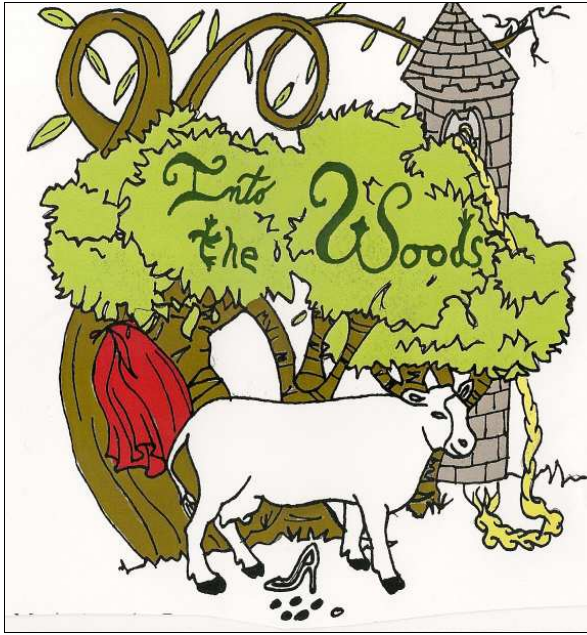
