## Message From the Principal

Dear Friends:

Christ was the “Word of God,” the Word which became flesh. We first heard the power of God’s word in Genesis when God said, “Let there be light,” and creation came to be. Today we speak of “dissing,” of “spinning,” and of “media hype.” No one’s word is good enough; we need binding contracts. “Not guilty” doesn’t mean “not guilty,” it means “I’m betting you can’t prove I did it.”

Then we remember Christ’s words to Pilate: I came into the world ... *to bear witness to the truth*; and all who are on the side of *truth* listen to my voice.” To his disciples he said, “I am the way, the truth, and the life.” It is time to restore a reverence for truth in the words we use. Remember the admonition, “If you can’t say something good, don’t say anything at all?” I sometimes wonder what students say to one another when they text multiple times a day. How much of what they say is gossip, speculation or hurtful? How sad that words can now be used to bully and MySpace, Face Book, and cell phone texting can be a source of great harm.

One of the saints said that to tell the mortal sin of another is to commit a mortal sin; to tell of a venial sin is to commit a venial sin, and to tell of a character fault is to reveal your own. If you saw the movie *Doubt*, you may remember the priest telling the story of a woman who confessed to gossip and was told to tear open a feather pillow on her roof top and then come back. When she returned, she was told that to repair the damage of gossip was like trying to collect all of the feathers that had been spread by the wind.

Let us work together to develop in our students a reverence for truth in the words they use. Truth always draws us closer to Christ and a reverence for the person of Christ whom we encounter in each person we meet. Let us model and help them develop the values which will serve as strong anchors for them as they face a world with few absolutes.

## Teacher Frank Hall Wins Golden Apple Award

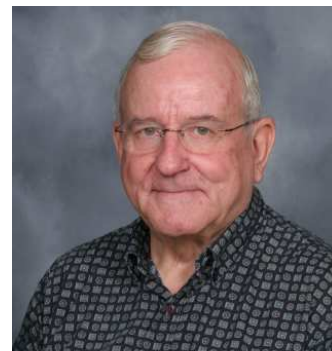

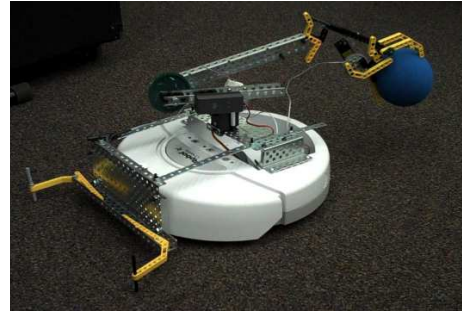

### In Fide et Caritate Award

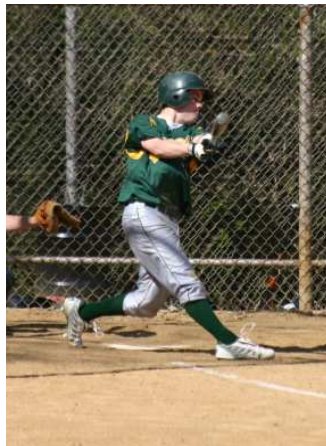
